FRIDAY 21 > 7:00 PM Exodus

Lazarus J. Finn is a JUNO award-winning reggae performer whose lyric-conscious music speaks to history, politics (he holds a degree in Political Science from the University of Toronto) and the human condition. 

It is an homage to the most important female vocalist to emerge out of South Africa and features energetic and heartfelt renditions of South African classic and traditional folk songs, including those that Miriam Makeba brought to the masses like Pata Pata, The Click Song and Jolinkomo. Klaasen's latest album, entitled Nouvelle Journée showcases new musical styles and songs touching on the importance of family, empathy, love and hope. She sings in the Tsonga, Sotho, isiZulu and Xhosa languages of South Africa, as well as in English and French.

OKAN, meaning 'soul' in the Afro Cuban Santeria religion, is an all-female Cuban band based in Toronto. Created in 2016 by percussionists, vocalists and composers Elizabeth Rodriguez and Magdelys Savigne, OKAN blends traditional Cuban music, jazz, and Afro Cuban style with world rhythms, to bring a fresh and modern touch to the roots of Cuban music. SUNDAY 30 • 3:00 PM Bill King's Saturday Night Fish Fry

Originally from Jeffersonville, Indiana, multi-talented musician and publisher Bill King spent his youth studying with W.C. Handy's former pianist Eva Smith and Indiana University saxophonist Jamey Aebersold. By the early 1960s, King had won 16 first place awards in classical piano and clarinet competitions. A three-time JUNO nominee, King's recording credits include Liberty Silver Live! In Session; Night Passage Years; Magnolia Nights; The Jazz Report All-Stars' Moment's Notice; From the Heart, a tribute to piano great Oscar Peterson; East Side Symphony and Rockit 88 Band's Too Much Fun. Over the years, King has worked with a host of legendary

artists including: The Pointer Sisters, Janis Joplin, Martha Reeves and Linda Ronstadt. Between 2001 and 2007, Bill recorded three albums with the Saturday Nite Fish Fry – Jump, Shout, Rock da House, Rhythm & Soul and Dirt Road Blues, each with a specific theme. Jump, Shout, Rock da House focuses on jump blues, featuring classic Jay McShann, low-down Professor Longhair, Charles Brown, Howlin' Wolf and others. Rhythm & Soul features the vocals of Brooklyn, New York entertainer Shakura S'Aida and Dirt Road Blues explores the blues side of Bob Dylan and soul of Eddie Hinton. The album pops with regional hits by little-known singers like Jessie Mae, Annisteen Allen, Mary Ann Fisher, Ann Cole, Sheri Washington, and the under-celebrated Ella Johnson, the guitar playing of Neil Chapman, a mighty horn section and the arranging/production skills of pianist band leader King. Working together often since 2007, King and Chapman are back together again sharing roots blues singing duties with Michael Dunston and Julian Taylor, with Shane "Shaky J' Forrest joining Chapman on guitar, Jesse 'Dubmatix' King on bass, Everton 'Pablo' Paul on drums and a three-piece horn section. A major player on the Canadian jazz scene, King currently publishes the Jazz Report Magazine, edits ejazznews.com, acts as artistic director for the Beaches International Jazz Festival as well as executive director of the National Jazz Awards. He also hosts the Bill King Show on CUIT 89.5 and is the music director/pianist for the Ted Woloshyn Show on Toronto's Newstalk 1010.

Toronto-based singer-songwriter Kayla Diamond is the 2015 winner of Slaight Music's It's Your Shot contest. Diamond discovered the award while in her second year of law school in Windsor, Ontario and upon winning, decided to pursue a full-time career in music. She is currently working with some of the country's top songwriters and producers to complete her debut EP, Beautiful Chaos, due late 2017 on Cadence Music.

Formed in 2008, MonkeyJunk has continually pushed boundaries and blurred genre lines to become synonymous with the emergence of a new kind of blues on the Canadian and international scenes. The band's most recent release, Time To Roll has them heading back to their blues roots, combining swampy blues and rock sounds with thoughtful lyrics and drawing inspiration from the sounds of John Lee Hooker and Lightnin' Hopkins to J.J. Grey & Mofo and The Meters. The Ottawa-based trio is comprised of vocalist, baritone guitarist, harmonica and organ player, Steve Marriner; lead guitarist Tony D; and drummer/percussionist Matt Sobb. Over the years, the band has won a collective 20 Maple Blues awards, two Canadian Independent Music awards, a Blues Music award, and have been nominated twice for a JUNO award, winning for "Blues Album of the Year" in 2012. The trio is joined on stage by award-winning Canadian blues singer/songwriter and harmonica player, Paul Reddick.
